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Welcome to Fabrica30

This festival celebrates the vibrant community and the remarkable artists and creators who have been a part of Fabrica since its inception in 1994.

Luciano Benetton, Oliviero Toscani and its first director Godfrey Reggio established Fabrica as a unique experience founded on principles such as cross-cultural dialogue, interdisciplinarity and push for social change. These concepts still guide Fabrica's program today and constitute the core of this festival, which brings together different generations of Fabrica fellows to forge new connections and generate new revolutionary ideas.





Over the course of thirty years, Fabrica has welcomed almost 800 young artists from 72 different countries in a 17th century villa near Treviso, renovated by Tadao Ando. These people were given a space and a time to create, experiment, and find their own voice as artists and creators. Fabrica30 showcases the richness and scope of the work they developed, both during their time at Fabrica and throughout their careers.

By gathering in one place the history of Fabrica, this festival also raises questions about its future. Where is this community bound? What are the challenges that it should address? How is its legacy going to resonate for the decades to come?





Solo exhibitions include Alongside Quad, Derby, (2020), Un-Earth OCAT Xi'an, China (2018), Unseen: The Lives of Looking Queen's House, Royal Museums Greenwich (2015), Cast Hasselblad Foundation, Gothenburg, Sweden (2009) and The Photographers' Gallery, London (2008). Projects in public space include Breathe for Ella (2023), Breathe: 2022 (2022) and Breathe (2012) each produced by Invisible Dust, and Linear (2010/12) for Art on the Underground, London. Group exhibitions include Salisbury Cathedral, Wellcome Collection, Tate Modern, 50th Venice Biennale, 3rd Lahore Biennale.

BIOGRAPHY: Born in Madrid in 1974, Jaime Hayon trained in industrial design. Oscillating between furniture, objects, tapestries and carousels, he creates a narrative universe uniquely his own, drawing upon his deep-rooted connection to art in all aspects of his life. His work reflects his perspective on the world, a playful yet insightful exploration of the human psyche expressed through his zoomorphic, colorful, and folkloric pieces. He began producing his significant body of work some twenty years ago and has constantly developed his aesthetic across various disciplines, including design, sculpture, and painting. Like a 21st-century archaeologist, he examines and excavates recurrent themes of diversity, metamorphosis, and hybridization to create a unique visual language that is accessible. intriguing, and instantly identifiable as Hayon. Jaime resides in Valencia, and has offices in Barcelona and Treviso. His work has appeared in the most prestigious art and design publications worldwide. He has won numerous awards, including the Spanish National Design Award and multiple Elle Decoration International Design Awards. He was recognized by Wallpaper Magazine as one of the most influential creators of the last decade, and lauded as a "visionary" and one of the most creative icons by Time magazine.

BIOGRAPHY: Gabriella Gómez-Mont is the founder and director of Experimentalista, a novel type of nomadic and creative office specialized in cities that constantly shifts shape to accommodate high-level, transdisciplinary collaborations across the world. She was also the former Chief Creative Officer of Mexico City, and the founder of Laboratorio para la Ciudad (2013-2018), the award-winning experimental arm and creative think-tank of the Mexico City government, reporting to the Mayor. Besides her fascination with all things city, Gabriella has been a journalist, visual artist, and director of documentary films, as well as a creative advisor to several cities, universities and companies. She has received several international recognitions for her work in different fields, such as the first prize in the Audi Urban Future Award, the Best Art Practice Award given by the Italian government, The Creative Bureaucrats Award by the city of Berlin, and the TED City 2.0 Prize, among others. She was also named one of the "100 most creative people in business" by Fast Company magazine. Gabriella is currently the co-founder of The Institute for Everything In-Between, and Visiting Professor of Practice and Senior Policy Fellow at UCL in London. She is also a Yale World Fellow, TED Senior Fellow, MIT Director's Fellow, Georgetown University Visiting Fellow, Canadian Urban Institute Senior Fellow, Institute for the Future Fellow, a Salzburg Seminar Fellow, a Fabrica Alumni and a World Cities Summit Young Leader.

BIOGRAPHY: Born in 1976. Nico Vascellari lives and works between Rome and Vittorio Veneto. His research engages with various practices, including performance, sculpture, installation, drawing, video, and sound exploration. Through an anthropological perspective, his works examine the connection between humans and nature, ancient and ritual phenomena, folklore and traditions, weaving them together with an underground aesthetic. His solo shows include Piazza della Signoria, Florence (upcoming), Palazzo Reale, Milan (upcoming), Palazzo Vecchio, Florence (2023), Palais De Tokyo, Paris (2017) and many others in Italy, France, UK, Albania, and Slovenia. His works have been exhibited at various national and international events, including the Mercosul Biennale (2022), October Salon, Belgrade (2021), and Biennal de Lyon (2019), and in institutions such as KW Institute for Contemporary Art, Berlin, Museo del '900, Milan, and Fondation Beyeler, Basel. Vascellari's works are part of the permanent collections of several prestigious museums and foundations worldwide.

She is a senior lecturer at Camera Arts (HSLU, Luzern) and is represented internationally by the Parisian gallery Les Filles du Calvaire.

His films are held in prestigious collections and shown at venues like Centre Pompidou, Kunstwerke Berlin, and Museo Reina Sofía. His works also appear on ARTE, CANAL+, ORF, and RAI.

BIOGRAPHY: The films of Brian M. Cassidy and Melanie Shatzky have premiered at the Berlin, Sundance, Toronto, Locarno and Rotterdam film festivals, and exhibited at The Museum of Modern Art, The National Gallery of Art, Le Musée de la Civilisation, ICA London, The Museum of the Moving Image and Lincoln Center in New York. Their feature debut, Francine, starring Academy Award winner Melissa Leo, was called "raw, intimate and observed with penetrating acuity" by The Hollywood Reporter and was selected as a New York Times Critics' Pick. Their documentary, The Patron Saints, was called "one of the most powerful Canadian documentaries of recent years" by POV Magazine. Cassidy and Shatzky also maintain an active photography practice and have had their work featured in GUP Magazine, Der Greif, Wired, Zeit Magazin, It's Nice That, FlakPhoto, and Slate. among others. In 2015, The Montreal International Documentary Festival (RIDM) invited the duo to guest curate A Photographer's Eye: Photography & The Poetic Documentary, a special program about the intersection of photography and documentary film, which was showcased at La Cinémathèque Québécoise. BIOGRAPHY: Ombrebueno is Sergi Sanchez, an illustrator, animator and animation director who loves to make things move. From 2001 to 2004 he worked for Fabrica, where he developed his first animation and comic projects. In 2008, the Italian Art Directors Club (ADCI) recognized his work as an animation director with four awards for the campaign Whatever is on your mind for the brand Durex. In 2019, he directed Wooden Mirror (now travelling around festivals), his most ambitious work as a director and author. A 12-minute animated short film created in collaboration with producer and writer Carlo Zoratti. In 2021, he co-founded JOANA95 with artists Enric Sants, Sawe, and David Feliu, a new working environment based in Barcelona. In 2022, he began an experience as a traditional animation teacher at the Joso School based in Barcelona. With over 23 vears of expertise, he has collaborated with several studios worldwide, including 1st Ave Machine, Bliss, Glassworks, Le Cube, Hampa Studio, and Not To Scale, among others.

Carlo Zoratti is a film director, screenwriter and producer. He filmed video clips and short films, founded Italian web ty Pronti Al Peggio, and has been art directing the international tours of singer Lorenzo Cherubini, aka Jovanotti. In 2013, he released The Special Need, his first feature film, which debuted at the 66th Festival del Cinema of Locarno and was recognized with the SXSW audience award, the Leipzig Golden Dove, and a nomination at the Italian Golden Globes and the Nastro D'Argento. In 2015, he founded Alpis, a production company. 

BIOGRAPHY: Berlin-based duo OY first came to prominence when singer-musician Joy Frempong joined forces with producer-musician Melodydreamer to form what is now known as a symbiotic avant-pop and genre-bending body of sound. Their symphonic odyssey expanded to new horizons in 2014, releasing their first collaborative album, No Problem Saloon in which they masterfully crafted a rich tapestry of African landscapes and pearls of wisdom. By then signed under the Belgian cult label Crammed Discs, the duo embarked on an outer space exode with Space Diaspora in 2016, a critically acclaimed concept album where retro and modern sounds dance in harmony. Vocal loops sprinkle the album with reflective notes on modern alienation while the bouncing beats, quirky samples, and electrifying synthesizers paint a cosmic dreamscape. Through a transnational prism, OY's music boldly blurs the lines and sinks the notion of borders into blissful oblivion. Notorious for their vibrant scenic presence, every performance captures the hearts of festivalgoers and music lovers with their wondrous storytelling and somersaulting rhythms, stretching the boundaries of music into uncharted realms. Their unique musical imprint is at the crossroads of many cultures and voices, which has led to 300+ shows in more than twenty countries and to appearances at festivals like Les Transmusicales, Les Eurockéennes, Sonar and Montreux Jazz. In March 2023, OY finally released their new long player World Wide We (Mouthwatering), and it once again underlines that OY's forte is bringing attention to societal issues while leaving listeners with a message of optimism.







INSTALLATION - CHURCH

Ardna Olive tree, red clay soil & burnt olive ash

Ardna, an Arabic term meaning "our land", is an installation consisting of an olive tree and a carpet of ash around it. Wrapping and protecting the plant, the ash represents a natural fertilizer for its roots and, at the same time, draws geometries traceable to a keffiveh. a symbol of Palestinian resilience and resistance. The ash becomes an emblem of hope, which, in the same way that it strengthens the olive tree and its belonging to the land, aims to do the same with the people of Palestine. In Ardna, execution and process are integral to the final installation. While composing the *keffiveh*. the artist enters a state of meditation and spirituality, sifting the ash with precise and sequential movements as if it were an act of devotion.

BIOGRAPHY: Born in 1995, Mohammed El Hajoui is an artist originally from Morocco. Graduated in Graphic Design and Art Direction at NABA, in Milan, he began to develop his artistic practice. In 2022, El Hajoui won a special award of the Arte Laguna Prize in Venice, which gave him the opportunity to participate in the Fabrica residency. In 2023, as a finalist in the Arte Laguna Prize, he exhibited the *Radici* project in Venice, at the Arsenale, and later in Milan. FABRICA30

INSTALLATION Tecnosuolo

Tecnosuolo is a new cultivation method based on textile fibers of biological origin such as linen, wool and cotton. In this installation, Tecnosuolo is obtained by repurposing production scraps from United Colors of Benetton's Green B line, with the aim of reducing the environmental impact of the textile industry. The installation shows Tecnosuolo both as a plant substrate and fertilizing substance for the sprouting of plants, and as mulch to encourage plant growth by protecting them from atmospheric phenomena.

BIOGRAPHY: Born in 1998 in Genoa, Davide Balda is a multidisciplinary designer interested in researching new materials and sustainable production processes. He graduated in Product Design from IED in Turin and holds a master's degree in Design, Creativity and Social Practices from the Unidee Academy of Fondazione Pistoletto in Biella. Davide identifies himself as an archaeodesigner, someone who researches and studies techno-fossils, natural and artificial residues produced by human activities, which is useful for investigating the past, rereading history and creating materials or artifacts.

A simple intervention, in the garden adjacent to the studio, a trail has been made in order to encourage more interactions with the space. Divided into two sections, light and shade, this project proposes the garden to encourage biodiversity with the growth of wild plants that will flourish in the alternating winter and summer semesters at Fabrica. 793 seeds of various wild plants, one representing each fabricante, have been mixed into "seed-balls". As a gesture, we invite past and present residents to contribute these to the garden.
